DO YOU KNOW WHAT TO DO?

Preparation is the key to knowing what to do in a stressful situation or during an emergency. A medical emergency can strike someone near to us at any time. Do you know what to do if someone needs emergency care? What if you are a long distance from a care center? By educating ourselves in basic first responder first aid and CPR, we can increase the chances of survival for someone in a critical situation. T-Craft can partner with the American Red Cross (ARC) to provide First Aid, CPR, and AED training so that we are better prepared to respond during a medical emergency. This training is open to T-Craft members and immediate family.



- Cost is \$90 per Adult student (travel fee is waived for T-Craft)
- No charge for materials/books
- Hands-on, get on the floor type class, not death by Powerpoint
- ARC First Aid/CPR certificate good for two years
- Duration is about 5 ½ hours (likely a Saturday class)
- Minimum Class Size - 8



This is a call to see if there is interest in this type of training. If there is enough interest in this offer, Pete Glick will schedule a class with the ARC. Expect a Saturday class. - Be sure oil Dip Stick is properly secured after checking oil quantity.
- Interior of aircraft is part of Post Flight cleaning, especially the carpet.
- Do Not let fuel nozzle hit or hang against fuel filler receptacle or bang against aircraft during fueling.
- Be careful not to hit aircraft with ladder, e.g. hitting struts.
